As the term ends and we find a moment to reflect on yet another fantastic term, we acknowledge the fact that we are indeed incredibly fortunate.

I am very excited to share some of the highlights:

Official report from the School Evaluation Authority:

• This was a very intense and detailed two-day visit with the purpose to conduct an independent evaluation of the whole school in terms of the areas referred to in The National Evaluation Instrument. The preliminary feedback was very positive and we received the formal report earlier this term. Please take note of the short summary of the formal report:

We take note of the report's recommendations and acknowledge that proper parental involvement will always be a challenge. Systemic results 2022:

The Western Cape Education Department (WCED) has been conducting Systemic Tests in Language and Mathematics for Grades 3 and 6 learners since 2002. The programme was extended to Grade 9 in 2010. The

results assist schools to identify areas for improvement and the WCED to identify areas of the curriculum that require additional support.

It is important to mention that we have absolutely no input or access to these tests. Nobody is allowed in class while the learners are writing. We also play no part in the marking of the papers or the processing of the results. The whole process is run by the WCED and we only receive the results and recommendations. A total of 984 public primary schools in the province wrote these tests in 2022.

Quintiles

The Minister, annually determines the national quintiles for public schools which must be used by the MECs to identify schools that may not charge school fees.


Schools in each province are, therefore, classified into five groups from the poorest to the least poor. Quintile 1 is a group of schools in each province catering for the poorest 20% of schools. Quintile 2 caters for the next poorest 20% of schools while **Quintile 5 schools represent the least poor**.


Schools receive money from government according to Quintiles. Quintile 1 schools receive the highest allocation per learner, while Quintile 5 receives the lowest.

Knysna Primary school is a Quintile 5 school, as we are regarded as an affluent school despite the fact that we are having many challenges with so many families not paying their school fees.


Summary of results

KPS, as we had done previously, maintained a fairly high standard again with some pleasing results. We also compared very well against the other Quintile 5 schools in the province. The Systemic results also compare well to our own Academic Schedules and is therefore a fairly accurate indication of our learners' academic performance.







Grade 6 results
